

The Public Interest Disclosure Act (PIDA) provides a framework for employees and members of the Workers' Compensation Appeal Tribunal (WCAT) to report specific kinds of serious wrongdoing with legislated protection from reprisal. Section 38 of PIDA requires WCAT to report annually on all disclosures of wrongdoing made in that year.
